New York Confidentiality Protocols for Victims of Domestic Violence and Endangered Individuals



Individuals experiencing actual or threatened violence frequently establish new addresses and telephone numbers. New York Insurance Law § 2612 requires a health insurer, including long-term care insurers, to accommodate a reasonable request made by a person covered by an insurance policy or contract to receive communications of claim-related information by alternative means or at an alternative address.

New York Insurance Law §2612 requires health insurers, including long-term care insurers, to accommodate a reasonable request made by a person covered by a long-term care insurance policy to receive communications of claim-related information by alternative means or at alternative locations if the person clearly states that disclosure of the information could endanger the person. The law prohibits a long-term care insurer from disclosing to the policyholder i) the name, address, telephone number or other personal information of the person requesting the accommodation or child residing with such person; ii) the nature of the health care services provided; or iii) the name, address or telephone number of the provider of covered services.

John Hancock requires such request be in writing. The written request must include:

- The name of the person against whom the request is being made;
- A statement that disclosing all or a part of the insured's information could endanger the person or child.
- The alternative address or other method of contact to which correspondence should be mailed, and alternative telephone number.
